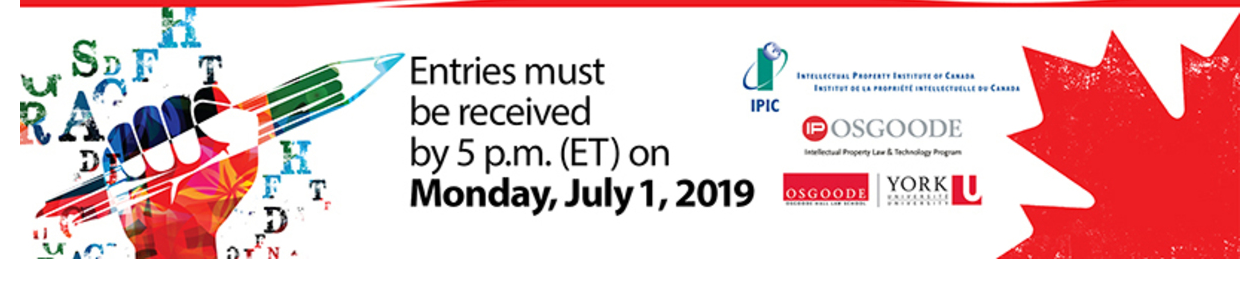

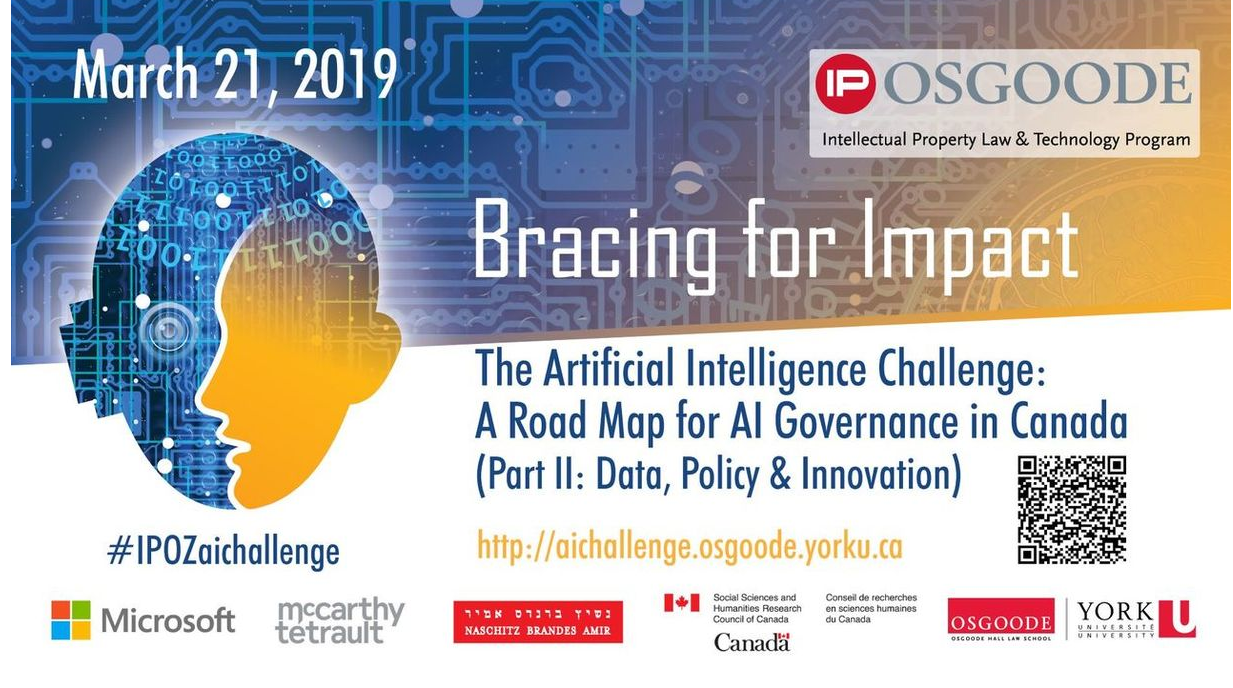

Government of Canada announces call to launch intellectual property collective.

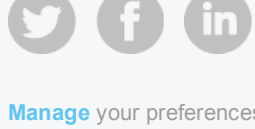
Government of Canada launches call for directors to oversee new College of Patent Agents and Trademark Agents as part of IP Strategy.
