

as important as it is today. In late 2018, the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate

Change (IPCC) released a landmark report warning that the humans now have 12 years to limit climate change before an irreversible environmental tipping point is reached. The IPCC report finds the world is on course for 3 °C of warming, double what they believe is the limit for humanity to stand a fighting chance. With devastating effects of climate change upon us, climate engineering stands as one of humanity's greatest chances at mitigating that change. As a result, our future depends on ensuring accessible, low cost climate technologies that are suitable for widespread use. 
