January 28, 2019 by Keenan Fast To the delight of patent litigators everywhere, the <u>doctrine of file wrapper estoppel is about to be</u> implemented in Canadian Patent Law. After more than 18 years since Justice Binnie rejected the doctrine in Canada in his ruling in Free World Trust v Electro Santé Inc., it will come into force via Bill C-86, likely in late 2019. While this move may help "fuel the overheated engines of patent litigation", it is not likely to help many other members of the patent community.
