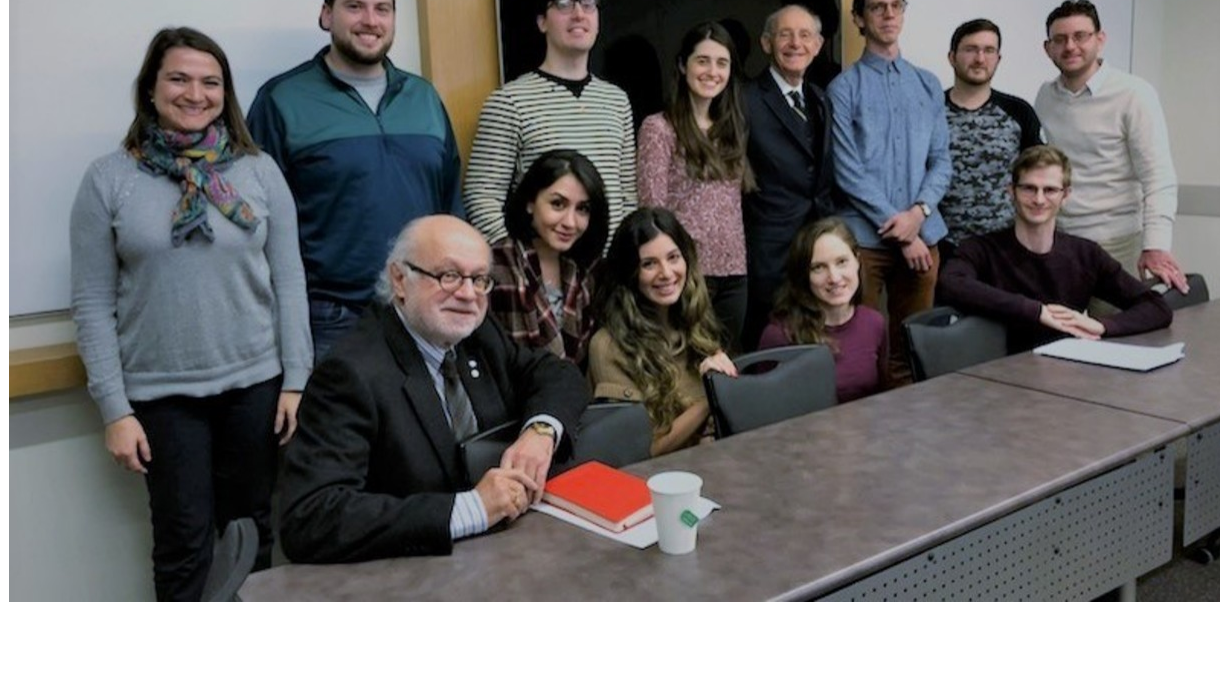

It was a thrilling tale of will they, won't they, but in the end Canada and the US agreed on a trade deal, which was signed today by Canada, the United States and Mexico at the G20 leaders' summit in Buenos Aires. While large parts of the new Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement (CUSMA) seem to be a

perfunctory rehash of NAFTA, the deal does have some significant consequences for IP law on the member states. As a long list of changes can be found throughout the IP chapter, I'll focus on the 'big league' stuff (i.e. copyright, patents and trademarks).
