



the best I can provide is a rough estimate. The cost of a patent can be broken down into two main types of cost: patent agent/lawyer fees and government fees. Since most of

In Canada, the average cost of a patent can vary from <u>CA \$10,000 – \$20,000</u>. In the US, the average cost of a patent is similar, ranging between US \$10,000 - \$20,000 though some sources claim it could cost upwards of US \$40,000. The costs are dependent on several factors, including the complexity of the invention, the quality of the work, and the number of back and forths with the intellectual property office.
