Media Marketing and Copyright Protection Collide Janaury 31, 2020 by Summer Lewis

The Curse of Iconic Fashion: When Social

In Fall 2019, Splash News <u>launched a lawsuit</u> against

Cardi B, Moschino and its Creative Director Jeremy Scott for infringing U.S. federal copyright law. Splash claims that social media posts of the celebrity in the fashion brand's iconic floral coat interfered with their photo-licensing business, as none of the parties obtained a license to use the photos. Splash News claims to have reached out to Moschino, making them aware of the photos and offering the brand "a license" for internal or social media use". Instead, Moschino allegedly copied the images from the Daily Mail, which was granted a license to publish

The Conference in Herzliya, Israel will take place on March 16th and March 17th, 2020.


